Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean.

(Mark 7:18-20)

Motorists don't leave their cars in no-parking zones because they don't want to have them towed away. Ordinary citizens don't break into other people's homes because they don't want to go to prison. Generally speaking, it's the consequence of our actions which makes us stop and think. We behave the way we do because the alternative is unatiractive.

What about the commandments? Why do we obey them? Is it because we fear that we will not have the happiness of heaven if we have no regard for the law of God? Is it just out of habit that we keep them, or is it because we would be ashamed if people found out we were liars, thieves or adulterers?

It's hard to be absolutely sure about our motives for anything. When we keep the law it may be because of deep-felt civic responsibility, but it may just be from fear of penalty. When we give up our time for some voluntary work, agree to play the organ in church, organise the Summer Fair or join a charitable group, are we not thinking just a bit about what's in it for us? Doesn't even our goodness mask a litile self-interest?

When Moses brought God's commandments to the people he told them to take notice. But he sold them to the Israelites on the strength of what they offered - life! He told them that if they obeyed the commandments of the law, then they would have the life that they wanted, they would take possession of the land they were hoping for, and everyone would see them as a wise and understanding nation.



The people who came in for criticism from Jesus were those who kept the laws, but whose heart was not in true religion. They observed the commandments right down to the last detail, but it was all a veneer; a mask; underneath it all they were self-seeking. So Jesus accuses them of casting aside what God wants and clinging to human traditions and customs which make them respectable in people's eyes. It's not what you do; it's what you mean to do.

The unusual thing about God's law is that its only purpose is to provide us with what's good for us. It has no hidden agenda. It's not as if God is manipulating things so that we all have to jump through legal hoops. To obey God's law results in the happiness which God planned for us and society. That's why they are called the commandments of life, because they promote all that's good about life. We obey them because we know what's good for us.

So why do I go to church? Why do I try to avoid theti, murder, cheating, gossiping etc.? Is it because I am really just? Or is it because I'm just under the mask?

Service to Remember the Gaul Fishing Trawler Tragedy

There will be a special service to remember the Gaul fishing trawler tragedy on **Saturday 19 September at 12.30pm**. A coach party of now 52 Retired Fishermen & their families are coming up to North Shields.

The service will take place at the plaque which was placed to mark the 40 years of the Gaul , last year. This is at Chirton Dene Quays, Albert Edward Dock, now Royal Quays Marina. This is where the Ranger Castor as she was then, berthed from. Thirty six lives were lost on the Gaul, of which six were from North Tyneside.

The visit is seen as a historical one and there hasn't been a group on this scale visiting North Shields since the Gaul was lost in February 1974. The special Service will be the starting point of the Hull visit to North Shields and a time to reflect, and to remember for both Hull and North Shields families.
