Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. (Mark 10:14)

It's a sad time for everyone when a marriage breaks down. There are no winners. Husband and wife, children, family and friends are all left with a sense of failure. Although there are some circumstances in which the well-being of the children is safeguarded when one parent leaves home, generally it is better for a child to grow up in the loving care of both its mother and father.


For Christians re-marriage is not possible after a divorce. This is not a regulation of the Church; it is a gospel teaching of Jesus. He calls such second marriages adulterous.

It can happen, though, that what looked like a perfectly normal marriage was never a marriage at all. After exhaustive investigation the Church can declare that the marriage was legal "on paper" but something was missing that made it fall short of the sacrament of matrimony. There can be many reasons for this and, when it happens, the Church can grant an annulment. Although not a divorce, it has the same effect since it allows the person to marry "again". It says that the first marriage was never a true marriage in the Christian sense.

Jesus' teaching on divorce is a stumbling block to many people. It doesn't sit very easily with some of society's views. Yet its purpose is not to be hard-faced or unsympathetic when problems arise. Its purpose is just the opposite. Jesus' ban on remarriage is part of his desire to strengthen the commitment of a couple to become one flesh, to provide a stable environment for the growth of the family and a support for couples who could easily be tempted to throw in the towel rather than do the harder job of working through problems and difficulties. Jesus' teaching on divorce is intended to protect the real nature of marriage.

When a man and woman marry, we say that the love they have for each other is a reflection of God's love for us, of the love Christ showed by taking our human nature and dying to redeem it. This love has two main characteristics: it will never be withdrawn from us no matter what we do, and it is absolutely unconditional. This love, which is for life, and without strings attached, is what two Christians are asked to declare when they make their promises to each other before God and the community.

Each of us has a responsibility to this teaching. We need to proclaim it not only with our lips but by our actions. It involves the duty to support others in their marriages, to make sure those conditions exist which help our brothers and sisters in Christ to live out their sacrament. This means defending all married people's attempts to reflect God's indissoluble love in their married lives, not just until it ceases to be convenient but "until death us do part".
