This Lent, the Parish Justice and Peace group have composed a Stations of the Cross which reflect on the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. These will be prayed in Our Lady and St Edmund Church at 3.00pm this Sunday 21st February, Immaculate Heart of Mary Church at 3.00pm on 28th February and St Edward's Church at 3.00pm on 13th March. Members of other local Christian communities will be invited to share in these times of prayer. Refreshments will be provided afterwards. All are welcome.

The strips of cloth, on which we wrote our Advent and Christmas prayers, have been sewn together to hang over three crosses—one in each of our churches. Just as those cloths wrapped the infant Jesus in the manger, they now hang on his cross. During Lent, you are invited to write on new cloths the names and intentions you wish to bring to God's mercy, and hang them on the cross near the altar in church.

First reading

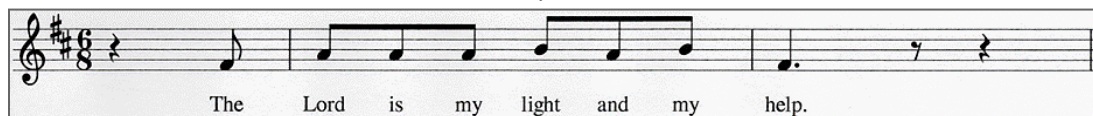
Genesis 15:5-12,17-18

Taking Abram outside, the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants.' Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified. 'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord,' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Second reading

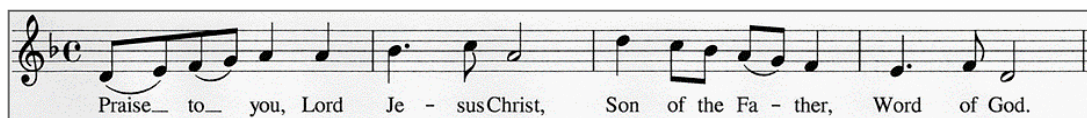
Philippians 3:17-4:1

Gospel

Luke 9:28-36
