## **LENT 2016 – A PILGRIMAGE OF MERCY**



Lent begins this week on Ash Wednesday. We are marked on our foreheads with blessed ashes with the sign of the cross. The ashes are a public sign of our faith and penance, and of our desire to enter the penitential season of forty days full of hope that God will pour out his mercy and grace upon us. This year, we are especially aware of wanting to grow and deepen our grasp of the depth of God's mercy and compassion, and we resolve to devote time to prayer, reading the scriptures and committing ourselves to fasting and almsgiving.

This Lent, the Parish Justice and Peace group have composed a Stations of the Cross which reflect on the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. These will be prayed in Our Lady and St Edmund Church at 3.00pm on Sunday 21st February, Immaculate Heart of Mary Church at 3.00pm on 28th

February and St Edward's Church at 3.00pm on 13th March. Members of other local Christian communities will be invited to share in these times of prayer. Refreshments will be provided afterwards. All are welcome.

The Sacrament of Mercy – Confession - is available during Lent at St Edward's Church each Saturday at 10.00am, at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church each Saturday at 5.15pm, and by appointment. The Sacrament is also available at St Mary's Church, Cullercoats each Saturday at 10.00am, and at St Cuthbert's Church, North Shields each Saturday at 5.00pm. A Deanery Lent Penitential Service will be arranged soon.

The strips of cloth, on which people wrote their Advent and Christmas prayers, have been sewn together to hang over three crosses—one in each of our churches. Just as those cloths wrapped the infant Jesus in the manger, they now hang on his cross. During Lent, you are invited to write on new cloths the names and intentions you wish to bring to God's mercy, and hang them on the cross near the altar in church.

# READINGS AT MASS SUNDAY, 7TH FEBRUARY 2016

The Order of Mass is in the Laudate Hymn book from Hymn 479 (page 200)

First reading Isaiah 6:1-2,3-8

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord of Hosts seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings. And they cried out to one another in this way, 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of Hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.' The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said: 'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of Hosts.' Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said: 'See now, this has touched your lips, your sin is taken away, your iniquity is purged.' Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying: 'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?' I answered, 'Here I am, send me. The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Psalm Psalm 137:1-5,7-8

Response: Before the angels I will bless you, O Lord.

- I thank you, Lord, with all my heart:
  you have heard the words of my mouth.
  In the presence of the angels I will bless you.
  I will adore before your holy temple.
- I thank you for your faithfulness and love, which excel all we ever knew of you.
   On the day I called, you answered; you increased the strength of my soul.
- 3 All earth's kings shall thank you when they hear the words of your mouth.
   They shall sing of the Lord's ways: 'How great is the glory of the Lord!'
- You stretch out your hand and save me, your hand will do all things for me.
   Your love, O Lord, is eternal, discard not the work of your hands.

Second reading 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you – believing anything else will not lead to anything. Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it. I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Luke 5:1-11

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats – it was Simon's – and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied, 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point. When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him. The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**
