We express our thanks to the Finance Committee for their excellent work in managing our Parish finances over the past year. Miles Walton has now retired as Committee Chairman, and we thank him for all he has done. Thanks also to Michael Reynolds, who has agreed to become the Chairman. Mgr Andrew.

The Committee make the following points for your consideration:

- The Parish annual accounts for the year ended 31st March 2016 have been completed and submitted to the Diocese. We would like to thank you for your continued generosity in your financial support of the parish.
- The money you are contributing is working harder for us as one parish, where the requirements for the three churches can be looked at in the round. This enables us to operate best practice and with the consolidation of our finances, gives us a stronger position to negotiate contracts for utilities and other requirements.
- Your amazing generosity is not confined to the parish. This past year you have donated a total of £3,969 to annual collections taken by the Diocese, and £9,817 to other charitable purposes, for example CAFOD's Appeal for the people of Nepal and Family Fast Day, the Apostleship of the Sea and the DePaul Trust. This total of £13,786 is a remarkable response to these various appeals.

We thank you very much for your generosity, which has improved the lives of many people across the world.

Luke 9:11-17

He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.'
