Advent lets us look back to those who looked ahead to the horizon of the coming of the Messiah – to reflect on the horizons of our own day – and to look beyond to Jesus Christ who comes to establish his kingdom of wisdom, justice, peace and truth. Happy Advent!

READINGS AT MASS 1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT, 27TH NOVEMBER 2016

The Order of Mass is in the Laudate Hymn book from page 200.

First reading

Isaiah 2:1-5 The vision of Isaiah son of Amoz, concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In the days to come the mountain of the Temple of the Lord shall tower above the mountains and be lifted higher than the hills. All the nations will stream to it, peoples without number will come to it; and they will say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the Temple of the God of Jacobthat he may teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths; since the Law will go out from Zion, and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.' He will wield authority over the nations and adjudicate between many peoples; these will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles. Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war. O House of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.
