Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2017

The churches in Germany prepared this year's week of prayer based on St Paul's second letter to the Corinthians. Fifty million Christians in Germany mostly belong to the Roman Catholic Church or one of the Protestant State Churches. Recent developments such as the reception of refugees and asylum seekers, have begun to change this balance and other Christian traditions are finding expression. Whilst that which unites the churches is stronger than that which divides, there are still areas of difference in which the churches remain self-absorbed or build new walls.

As the churches in Germany considered how to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation this year, they looked for a way to stand together. They found inspiration in *Evangelii Gaudium*, the Apostolic

Exhortation of Pope Francis, which encourages acts of repentance and reconciliation, because 'the Love of Christ compels us' (*2 Corinthians 5:14*).

St Paul tells us that God has, in Christ, reconciled the world to himself. The love of Christ compels us to be ambassadors of this reconciliation and calls for a moment of repentance before we draw from the well of forgiveness. This repentance acknowledges division, names the reasons and acknowledges the walls of human sinfulness. Reconciliation happens when walls are dismantled. Those who have been reconciled in Christ are called to proclaim this reconciliation in word and deed, to all the world. The world needs ambassadors of reconciliation to break down walls, build bridges and open doors to new ways of life. We pray on this Sunday within the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity for Christians everywhere, that we might be true ambassadors of reconciliation between ourselves and others.

First reading

Isaiah 8:23-9:3

Psalm 26:1,4,13-14

In days past the Lord humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in days to come he will confer glory on the Way of the Sea on the far side of Jordan, province of the nations. The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase; they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time, as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor – these you break as on the day of Midian. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Gospel

Matthew 4:12-23

Hearing that John had been arrested, Jesus went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled: *'Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan, Galilee of the nations! The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned.'* From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they left their nets at once and followed him. Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him. He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.
