MASS READINGS SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (YEAR A) FIRST READING

Acts 8:5-8, 14-17

They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town. When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong. Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

### **Catholic Social Teaching: Solidarity**

In the weeks ahead, when space allows in the newsletter, Fr Chris, will highlight and briefly explain a theme in Catholic Social Teaching for you explore how this theme could apply in the general election debate. This week he will look at the theme of 'Solidarity'. This important concept of Catholic social teaching comes into play when the primary principles such as the common good and the dignity of the human person is not acknowledged. When this is the case then there will be injustice and suffering and anguish caused by poverty, denying people basic rights, discrimination, violence, unnecessary medical conditions, depression.

We as a community of faith are called have some empathy and to appreciate that though we may be on the other side of the world we are in a relationship with these people and have a responsibility to meet their needs. Nothing can replace being at person face to face to encourage a feeling of deep solidarity but the media at time can give us powerful images that provoke a deep cry of compassion and a desire to do justice. One thinks of the young woman during the Vietnam War on fire with napalm. More recently the body of a little boy washed up at the shore of Italy during the recent refugee crisis. Are there images you have seen in your real life or in the media or in a film such as 'I Daniel Blake' that arise a profound feeling of solidarity with others. What response does such solidarity arise from you?
