INSTRUCTIONS FOR MY FUNERAL MASS

When a loved one dies, it is a difficult time. Arrangements have to be made, and the pressure to make quick decisions can compound the difficulty. As we approach our own passing, we are sometimes encouraged to make that time easier for those left behind. One way in which we can do this is by leaving clear instructions concerning our wishes for our funeral. At the back of each church in our parish there is now a supply of leaflets, entitled 'Instructions For My Funeral Mass', designed to help relatives in the event of death. While not having any legal force, such a document may well help the bereaved to make decisions that will respect the wishes of the deceased. This is not morbid, but a final kind courtesy to our family. Sadly, it is becoming more common for non-practising relatives of devout Catholics to overlook a deceased relative's wishes for a Catholic funeral. You are encouraged to have a look at these forms and, if appropriate, take one home for your own or another's use.

READINGS AT MASS 12TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR, 25TH JUNE 2017

The Order of Mass is in the Laudate Hymn book from page 200.

First reading Jeremiah 20:10-13

Jeremiah said: I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side!" Denounce him! Let us denounce him!' All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall, 'Perhaps he will be seduced into error. Then we will master him and take our revenge!' But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero; my opponents will stumble, mastered, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs. But you, O Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice, who scrutinise the loins and heart, let me see the vengeance you will take on them, for I have committed my cause to you. Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of evil men. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm Psalm 68:8-10,14,17,33-35

Response: In your great love, answer me, O Lord.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.
