The first reading today tells of Elijah's flight from the threat of persecution, his encounter with God on Mount Horeb. It was a trek of 40 days and 40 nights and it links in with Peter's encounter with Jesus, the Son of God on Lake Galilee. Elijah was so close to God and he knew how gentle and understanding God was. A light murmuring sound is literally 'a sound of silence' this is where Elijah experienced the presence of God. The Christian people are often depicted as in a boat, with Peter at the helm. Without Jesus they were getting exhausted and frustrated. When Jesus appears everything changes, first terror then amazement. Peter rushes out to meet him, loses confidence only to be swiftly rescued. We are left with the thought – how does Jesus come to me? In the joys of family? In the worries of a job? or in the staggering beauty of creation. All of these bring God's presence close and without which we cannot cope. Jesus does not force himself on us, he just says 'Here I am if you want me' He may disappear into the sea mist for a time, and we may sink into the water but it all ends with a welcome and a recognition that Jesus is there for us always, on our journey of faith.

Gospel

Matthew 14:22-33

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped.
