The last few years of the Awards has certainly shown us that this is true here in England and Wales. For example, Angeline Umba, a student at Holy Cross College in Bury, developed an awareness raising campaign about violence against girls. Angeline organised a creative writing and drawing competition for a poetry book. To prepare students Angeline led a discussion about the effects of violence not only on the young women and girls in Africa but in Britain as well. Her seminar was so inspiring that the RE department invited Angeline into RE lessons to present to her peers.
