Jeremiah 20:7-9

The word of the Lord has meant insult for me.

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger. I am a daily laughing-stock, everybody's butt. Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!' The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long. I used to say, 'I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more.' Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones. The effort to restrain it wearied me, I could not bear it.

Response: For you my soul is thirsting, O Lord my God.

This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

If anyone wants to be a follower of mine. let him renounce himself.

Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said 'this must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.' Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life? 'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

Celebrating Young People Awards

These honour the contributions made by our young people in the area of social action - transforming the lives of others, often in very low-key ways. Awards are given in 6 categories, each related to a different area of Catholic social teaching, from peace building to the dignity of work. There is also the overall 'Pope Francis Award', presented this year by Archbishop Malcolm McMahon at the awards ceremony in London on 23 November 2017. Pope Francis reminds young people of this enormous capacity for transformation when he says, "A better world can be built also as a result of your efforts, your desire to change and your generosity." The last few years of the Awards has certainly shown us that this is true here in England and Wales. For example, Angeline Umba, a student at Holy Cross College in Bury, developed an awareness raising campaign about violence against girls. Angeline organised a creative writing and drawing competition for a poetry book. To prepare students Angeline led a discussion about the effects of violence not only on the young women and girls in Africa but in Britain as well. Her seminar was so inspiring that the RE department invited Angeline into RE lessons to present to her peers. I hope you will consider nominating a young person or a group of young people.
