## Feast of the Transfiguration

Since the Feast of the Transfiguration is on a Sunday we will celebrate this feast. In the Gospel we get a true glimpse of the glory of Christ but for this glory to be ultimately manifested the passion and the self-giving of the Cross must be entered into. This event is also seen as the Christ event being a fulfilment of the Law and the Prophets of the Hebrew Scripture tradition. This counter intuitive and counter cultural way of the embracing of suffering and death to new life is at the heart of the Gospel. The apostles are told that we are called by God in that experience on a mountain to listen to Christ, we must likewise. We are also called to imitate that self-giving for leading to our own transformation and in doing, sharing in Christ's glory.

As the poet Michael Symon-Roberts has acknowledged, the date of August 6th has also , in quoting William Blake from his poem 'Tyger Tyger', a 'fearful symmetry'. Since in remembering the glory of Christ being manifested in an utter brightness, this date also acknowledges another manifestation of utter bright light, but this time in not the revelation of the life giving salvation of God offered in Christ but the destructive brightness of the first explosion of an atomic bomb at Hiroshima on August 6th, 72 years ago today. That a small number countries still have a huge number of similar weapons of Mass destruction is still a cause for major concern at a time of uncertainty and instability. We pray that world's leaders will seek to be rid of these weapons that not only drain scarce resources that could be used for health and education but are also a constant questioning of the world's continuation as we know it.. We also pray for those in Nagasaki and Hiroshima still alive who live with the effects of that bomb. Whether one has a 'unilateral' or 'multilateral' approach to nuclear weapons disarmament, ones desire to rid the world of weapons, which could kill millions if just one of the many thousands of warheads that exist were used. must be part of our response in sharing in the glory of the Crucified and Risen Christ and in seeking his Kingdom of truth, holiness, justice and peace.
