Fr Chris sees these ministries as: Prayer and Worship, Evangelism & Worship, Teaching & Formation, Pastoral Care. Prophetic and Social Outreach and Administration. Fr Chris is aware that there are a number of groups such as Liturgy and Formation Group, Catechists, Finance & Property Group, Social Group that take responsibility for a number of these ministries. Inspired by the day on Ministry of Consolation, a small group of parishioners came together to discuss how pastoral care especially for those experience a death of a loved one or another experience of loss can be referred to many excellent services already on offer or supported within the parish. It was evident that there is a lot of experience and expertise in offering care though more importantly our most important qualification shared by us all was being human, had experienced loss and know the value of listening and being present to others.

Fr Chris proposes that this group be simply designated 'The Pastoral Carers Group', which is open to other parishioners, that will meet to develop resources and provision in the parish to support anyone who needs help. A Church Without Priests?

Professor Werner Jeanrond, Master of St Benet's Hall at Oxford University - the first lay person to hold this post - will give a lecture here at Holy Name Church on Thursday 26 October at 7pm on A Church without Priests? The need for new forms of leadership in the Catholic Church. He is one of the most important theologians working in Britain today and has taught in several European countries. Professor Jeanrond believes the renewal of our Church requires a radical rethinking of ministry. He asks: Where is the Church to be found? Where there is a priest or where there are people responding to Christ's invitation to build up God's reign? If the first is true, the Church will come to an end when the last priest dies. If the second scenario is right, the Church flourishes wherever people gather together around the good news of God's project of creation. As the number of priests declines and our diocese reorganises and rethinks its future, Professor Jeanrond's message is one all should hear.
