We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command the Lord himself will come down from heaven: those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.

'Walking With in North Tyneside': could you consider becoming a Trustee?

Walking With provides relief and support for refugees, asylum seekers, those without national status and others experiencing need, hardship or distress. From our base within St Luke's Church, Frank Street, Wallsend, we provide them with a safe and welcoming place, treat them with dignity and empathy, get to know and understand their situation and aspirations, and help them stand on their own feet in our wider community. Our aim is to help those who come to us feel less isolated, more self-confident, better able to settle and adjust to life in Britain, more likely to integrate with their neighbours and thus to make a contribution to the society in which they live and work.

Walking With is a Registered Charity. It's run by an Executive Committee, whose members have the status, in Charity law, of trustees. Trustees have independent control over, and legal responsibility for, a charity's management and administration. They ensure their charity is carrying out its purposes for the public benefit; they plan what their charity will do, and what they want it to achieve: with their co-trustees, they make balanced and adequately informed decisions, thinking about the long term as well as the short term; they make sure the charity's assets are used only to support or carry out its purposes; and they need to be able to demonstrate that their charity is complying with the law, well run and effective. This team needs and deserves support from their Executive Committee. This is about policy making and the raising and management of resources, of course. But it's potentially a great deal more than that. Trustees can be extremely helpful as ambassadors for the Charity, making sure as best they can that our aims and work are well understood and supported. A Trustee who is prepared to apply his or her skills and experience in contributing to some aspect or other of the work of the Charity will be particularly welcome.

Some current issues: All the ten Syrian families referred to above are now settled in various parts of North Tyneside, and a second support worker (employed by the Council) is now helping address some of their pretty formidable needs, helped by excellent volunteer input. It has been agreed in principle to attempt to replace our Project Manager, nominally a half-time appointee, when she retires next summer, with a full-time person. Budget provision has been anticipated in the funding projections, but no work has yet been commenced on the recruitment and appointment work. There are quite a few areas where we need to update or formalise our policies, and where some new input would make a huge difference to how we deal with, for instance, outreach and public relations. Walking With needs you! A number of our Trustees have stood down for health or other reasons over the last year and it's time to take a fresh look at ourselves, and to consider how much better we might do with some new trustees. We're planning to hold our Annual General Meeting on 6 December. That's when new and existing members of the Executive Committee will be elected. We need new talent - might that mean you?
