MASS READINGS FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) FIRST READING

Job 7:1-4, 6-7

Restlessly I fret till twilight falls.

Job began to speak: Is not man's life on earth nothing more than pressed service, his time no better than hired drudgery? Like the slave, sighing for the shade, or the workman with no thought but his wages, months of delusion I have assigned to me, nothing for my own but nights of grief. Lying in bed I wonder, 'When will it be day?' Risen I think, 'How slowly evening comes!' Restlessly I fret till twilight falls. Swifter than a weaver's shuttle my days have passed, and vanished, leaving no hope behind. Remember that my life is but a breath, and that my eyes will never again see joy.

Responsorial Psalm
Response: Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted.

- 1. Praise the Lord for he is good; sing to our God for he is loving: to him our praise is due.
- 2. The Lord builds up Jerusalem and brings back Israel's exiles, he heals the broken-hearted, he binds up all their wounds. He fixes the number of the stars; he calls each one by its name.

SECOND READING Corinthians 9:16-19. 22-23

I should be punished if I did not preach the Gospel.

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? It is this in my preaching, to be able to offer the Good News free, and not insist on the rights which the gospel gives me. So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could. For the weak I made myself weak. I made myself all things to all men in order to save some at any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of the gospel, to have a share in its blessings.

GOSPEL Mark 1:29-39

He cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another.

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them. That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was. In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.

As you will see, the most popular choice was to have the Masses on a morning. Having discussed this with the Bishop, it has been decided that to take another vigil Mass away from the deanery would not be helpful to those who wish to go to a Vigil Mass. He asked the partnership as a whole to discuss the times of Masses and decide as a partnership. Therefore, any decision will be deferred till later on in the year. The Bishop has asked for the priests and the partnership development group to discuss this and come to a decision.

Action Tutoring

Action Tutoring, an education charity that provides support to disadvantaged pupils through tutoring, delivered entirely by volunteers. They work with primary and secondary school pupils delivering tutoring programmes in Maths and English in Newcastle They support those pupils who are at risk of not meeting national standards in their GCSEs or SATs and are facing socio-economic disadvantage, meaning they wouldn't otherwise have access to this kind of help. They want them to reach their potential and ensure that the circumstances they are born into do not affect their chances of success. They are looking for volunteers to support us by tutoring a pupil for just one hour a week, for approximately 8-10 weeks. Their tutoring takes place on the school premises and their volunteers work with the same pupils every week, meaning they can see first hand the impact they are having. They have a member of our team present at every session and provide training and specially designed workbooks for all of our tutors. They have many programmes running from Monday to Friday. They would love to get members of local faith communities involved with their volunteering. They have programmes running in Newcastle. Would you be able to share this opportunity with them?
