**FIRST READING**

*I will make you the light of the nations*

**Isaiah 49:1-6**

Islands, listen to me, pay attention, remotest peoples. The Lord called me before I was born, from my mother's womb he pronounced my name. He made my mouth a sharp sword, and hid me in the shadow of his hand. He made me into a sharpened arrow, and concealed me in his quiver. He said to me, 'You are my servant (Israel) in whom I shall be glorified'; while I was thinking, 'I have toiled in vain, I have exhausted myself for nothing'; and all the while my cause was with the Lord, my reward with my God. I was honoured in the eyes of the Lord, my God was my strength. **Acts 13:22-26**

Paul said: "God made David the King of our ancestors, of whom he approved in these words, "I have selected David son of Jesse, a man after my own heart, who will carry out my whole purpose. To keep his promise, God has raised up for Israel one of David's descendants, Jesus, as Saviour, whose coming was heralded by John when he proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the whole people of Israel. Before John ended his career he said, "I am not the one you imagine me to be; that one is coming after me and I am not fit to undo his sandal." 'My brothers, sons of Abraham's race, and all you who fear God, this message of salvation is meant for you.'

**Luke 1:57-66. 80**

The time came for Elizabeth to have her child, and she gave birth to a son; and when her neighbours and relations heard that the Lord had shown her so great a kindness, they shared her joy. Now on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child; they were going to call him Zechariah after his father, but his mother spoke up. 'No,' she said 'he is to be called John.' They said to her, 'But no one in your family has that name', and made signs to his father to find out what he wanted him called. The father asked for a writing-tablet and wrote, 'His name is John.' And they were all astonished. At that instant his power of speech returned and he spoke and praised God. All their neighbours were filled with awe and the whole affair was talked about throughout the hill country of Judaea. All those who heard of it treasured it in their hearts. 'What will this child turn out to be?' they wondered. And indeed the hand of the Lord was with him. Meanwhile the child grew up and his spirit matured. And he lived out in the wilderness until the day he appeared openly to Israel.

#### **Week-end Masses in the Parish**

Fr Chris is very grateful to the parish council for an honest discussion about Mass times in the parish on June 20<sup>th</sup>. The role of the parish council is to advise and not to make decisions. In the light of the discussion - Fr Chris has decided on the following:

- Although it is clear that some of the parish would prefer to have the Sunday morning Mass at an earlier time, having Mass at a later time allows young families and older parishioners more time to come from various parts of the parish for the one Sunday morning Mass in the parish.
- There is not a clear consensus within the parish as to which of our two Churches should host respectively the Vigil and Sunday Morning Masses.
- Having had a three month period of the Vigil Mass at St Cuthbert's and the morning Mass at St Joseph, I have decided that the way forward to arrive at a final decision is to have a three month trial period starting the weekend of July 7-8<sup>th</sup> when the Vigil Mass will be at St Joseph's at 5.30pm and the morning Mass at St Cuthbert's at 11.00am. At the end of the period, having given the parish the opportunity to experience and reflect on both options, there will be a vote in about three months. Fr Chris will accept the simple majority. Unlike the last vote there is no need to consult the Bishop, so the vote will be binding.
- It has been made very clear to Fr Chris that there is an important priority for the whole parish to develop a shared sense of collective identity, so that we have a clear perception of our parish, our churches and our partnership. At the next meeting of the parish council on July 25<sup>th</sup>, I will be asking the parish council to reflect on we can develop a shared sense of unity and community within our parish. Any suggestions from parishioners would be very welcome.
- I appreciate that all that is said above creates more change and uncertainty for another period but it is with the hope that by the end of the process we will have certainty and clarity, that will enable the parish to move forward, so that we can be a living sign and instrument of Christ as his community of disciples. Let us pray for all our parish.
