Tuesday 26th March - 2.00 pm Diocesan Schools Event: Diocesan schools will welcome Bishop Robert.





Currently a typical cocoa farmer in Cote d'Ivoire lives on around 74p a day. For the women the situation is even worse and they often have fewer rights than men.
