SUNDAY READINGS REFLECTION

Coming out of our comfort zone is uncomfortable. This might seem obvious, but it is what God wants us to do in order to help someone in need. They may be closer than you think, an elderly parent or a sibling experiencing difficulty, a neighbour struggling just to get to the shops. Royalty had a different meaning to our ancestors than it does today. We see the royal family and the Queen regularly on TV but largely as a figurehead of the Government of the day. In biblical times royalty ruled directly. Paul speaks to Timothy of God (who is much higher than earthly rulers) and Lord of everything. The rich man and Lazarus is another warning about wealth, not to make us insulate ourselves against those who have less, but to engage as best we can with their needs and to help wherever possible.

The almighty Lord says this: Woe to those ensconced so snugly in Zion and to those who feel so safe on the mountain of Samaria, those famous men of this first of nations to whom the House of Israel goes as client.
