SUNDAY READINGS REFLECTION

God's love is open to all not just the Israelite nation. We have the example of Naaman, a foreigner and commander of an Army opposed to Israel. He has leprosy but takes the advice of Elisha the prophet. By having faith, he washes seven times in the Jordan and is cured. The two mules of earth he takes back was a belief that the God of Israel could only be worshipped on the soil of Israel, so he takes some with him and vows only to worship Elisha's God in future. All ten lepers were cured but only one was healed. A foreigner returns to the Lord to give thanks. The Christian heart is a grateful one. We sometimes find that people whose lives are very difficult on the outside have a grateful heart on the inside. They give thanks for what they have, rather than what they have not.

READINGS AT MASS 28TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR, 13TH OCTOBER 2019

The Order of Mass is in the Laudate Hymn book from page 200.

First reading 2 Kings 5:14-17

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child. Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

Remember the Good News that I carry, 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal – but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it. Here is a saying that you can rely on: If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him. If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self. The word of the Lord **Thanks be to God**.

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'
