Reflection - All Saints Day, Sunday 1 November

The book of revelation promises that those who are faithful to God and Christ will be gathered together and delivered into the peace of God's presence. Its message is that we should stand firm with our faith. In these odd days of lockdown we can be at peace, even if we grumble at times and have to walk twice as far to go around a barrier. Matthew's gospel gives us the eight blessings called the Beatitudes, pointing out ways of living the faithful life today. The hand of God is resting on us through our baptism by the gift of the Holy Spirit. Above all, the gospel is about giving out peace to those around us. Whatever happens in our lives let us be known as people of peace.

COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS IN CHURCH

We all benefit from the care we receive from our stewards, who look after us so well at Mass and who sanitize the church after use, as required by Covid-19 regulations. We assure our stewards of our heart-felt thanks in these challenging times. We also thank the Parish Consolation Team who prepare families for funerals and act as stewards during these celebrations.

Thank you for the hard work undertaken by volunteers that has enabled us to open the Immaculate Heart Church, West Monkseaton which is available for funerals and baptisms. Our Lady's & St Edmund's Church, Backworth, remains closed.

St Edward's Church is strictly limited to 60 people for Mass. Once this number is reached, no one can enter the church. Please think about attending Mass during the week rather than the weekend, to help with numbers. To make sure of a place at the 6.00pm Vigil or 10.00am Sunday Masses, YOU MUST PHONE IN ADVANCE on 07340 169249 on a Thursday: 10.00am - 12.00 Noon, 2.00pm - 4.00pm and 6.00pm - 8.00pm, or on a Friday: 10.00am - 12.00 Noon and 2.00pm - 4.00pm. Thanks also to the parishioners who manage the bookings. If you come as a family, please make that known when you book. You will be asked for your contact details for 'Track and Trace' when you phone and when attending weekday Mass. The NHS App code can be scanned in the Narthex. You must not come to church if you have any symptoms of Covid-19, or are feeling unwell.

You must wear a face covering in church. Please enter the church only through the Narthex and exit as directed by the stewards. The church doors must be open during Mass to ensure the circulation of fresh air as part of Covid-19

protection. Please take the bulletins away with you. Please place Gift Aid and cash donations in the baskets in the Narthex. For Holy Communion, everyone joins the procession with social distancing as directed by the stewards – even if you are not receiving. Holy Communion is distributed only in the hand and in silence. When you have received the Sacred Host, please remove your face covering and consume it immediately – <u>do not carry the Sacred Host back to your place</u>. At the end of Mass, please leave the church immediately as directed by the stewards.

READINGS AT MASS ALL SAINTS' DAY, YEAR A, 31ST OCTOBER & 1ST NOVEMBER 2020

First Reading Apocalypse 7:2-4,9-14

I, John, saw another angel rising where the sun rises, carrying the seal of the living God; he called in a powerful voice to the four angels whose duty was to devastate land and sea, 'Wait before you do any damage on land or at sea or to the trees, until we have put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God.' Then I heard how many were sealed: a hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all the tribes of Israel. After that I saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They shouted aloud, 'Victory to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels who were standing in a circle round the throne, surrounding the elders and the four animals, prostrated themselves before the throne, and touched the ground with their foreheads, worshipping God with these words, 'Amen. Praise and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen.' One of the elders then spoke, and asked me, 'Do you know who these people are, dressed in white robes, and where they have come from?' I answered him, 'You can tell me, my lord.' Then he said, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb.' The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**
