Apostles 2:1-11

Galatians 5:16-25

They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak.

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

SECOND READING
The fruit of the Spirit.

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desires. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

Alleluia, alleluia! Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Alleluia!

The Spirit of truth will lead you to the complete truth.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Advocate comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness. And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset. I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'

St Cuthbert's Presbytery

On April 30th there was a fruitful meeting with four members of Tyneside Welcomes (TW) and Minnie Frazer from the Diocese and myself. In the light of the discussion and the questions raised, these are the key points:

TW liked the house and since 4+ bedroom properties are rare for rent, TW would be happy for a refugee family to reside at the presbytery.

It will be a family, perhaps an extended family. They would have been classed as 'Vulnerable', by the Home Office. TW did admit that could mean a number of things, someone may have a physical disability; someone may have been traumatised. The needs of the family will have to be assessed. The family would have probably come from a refugee camp in Lebanon or Jordan.

For the first year TW have a legal obligation to support the family. I think a group in the parish to work with this group maybe useful (perhaps including but not exclusively SVP). TW will still be in touch with the family after that year but hopefully from a distance.

Any agreement to rent the property to the family will have to be of a minimum of two years.

Questions that the parish has to decide are the following:

Would we want the family to move on after two years or are we happy to allow them longer.

We need to work out rent. The diocese will assist us in working out what a suitable amount would be.

Minnie Frazer recommended the normal diocesan practice in renting out property for it to be done by a letting agency. They would sort out arranging repairs etc but would take 10-15% of the rent. If we do not go down that route we would need someone or some others in the parish to take responsibility to sort out repairs.

I am also aware that elsewhere in the Partnership, at Our Lady Star of the Sea Parish, there is a 'Consolation Team'. I have asked a member of that group to address our Pastoral Care Group on Tuesday 8th June at 7pm. If anyone is interested in the work of this group, please let me know. This is an area of ministry I sense needs to be developed within the parish.

Faith Witness Against Hassockfield

In October, the UK government plans to open an Immigration Removal Centre at Hassockfield on the site of the former Medomsley Detention Centre. This will be for 80 women seeking asylum in the UK. The proposal is inhumane, unjust and incompatible with our faith which calls us to recognise the intrinsic dignity of each person. These women are not criminals to be locked up but people like ourselves who have the right to a place of safety and to be treated with respect and compassion. An interfaith prayer service will take place on Sunday 23rd May at 3.00pm in as many churches and places of worship as possible as part of a united faith response against Hassockfield. The Youth Ministry Team will join with the Faith Witness and will go live at the same time on YMT's Facebook@youthministryteam.
