ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) FIRST READING

I make low trees grow.

Ezekiel 17:22-24

The Lord says this: 'From the top of the cedar, from the highest branch I will take a shoot and plant it myself on a very high mountain. I will plant it on the high mountain of Israel. It will sprout branches and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar. Every kind of bird will live beneath it, every winged creature rest in the shade of its branches. And every tree of the field will learn that I, the Lord, am the one who stunts tall trees and makes the low ones grow, who withers green trees and makes the withered green. I, the Lord, have spoken, and I will do it.'

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 91

Response: It is good to give you thanks, O Lord.

SECOND READING Corinthians 5:6-10

Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight - we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

Alleluia, alleluia! I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have make known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Mark 4:26-34

It is the smallest of all the seeds; yet it grows into the biggest shrub of them all.

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because the harvest has come.' He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.' Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

Response from Mayor's Office re Alexandra Scott Park

The Mayor's Office have responded to the concerns expressed the Green, Fair, Healthy Action Team of Tyne and Wear Citizens about the state of Alexandra Scott Park. It would seem that our campaigning is bearing fruit. Many thanks to those who have supported the Campaign. Please see below what the Council has said.

Norma would potentially meet people via Zoom, but not in person.

Northumberland Park and another one had about £1m (Lottery?) funding to upgrade them, she says they had to decide which parks and there wasn't enough for all of them.

The Mayor would support us in making one or more funding bids to enhance the park if we wished, which she felt would be likely to succeed:

The Mayor is keen to engage with us and to do what is in her power. Whether that could include the increased dog-fencing, new seating etc., and renewed play facilities is not clear at this moment

It was also agreed that the following actions would take place.

Repainting of metal seats.

Removal of graffiti.

Renewal of 'no dog fouling' signage.

The street cleansing team have been asked to check the park on a regular basis and carry out litter picking.

They will replace the existing dog bin with a larger capacity dog/litter bin.

Proposal to plant more trees.

The swing seats were removed due to vandalism, however there are plans to replace them for the summer. They will also be carrying out a test to the zip wire frame as part of our safety checks, to make sure it remains safe for use.

There is a meeting with a representative of North Tyneside Council on 23rd June at 12.30 at the park to discuss people's concerns about the park.. Anyone in the parish interested is welcome to be at that meeting
