SUNDAY REFLECTION

We have seen the type of person a prophet is; he speaks God's word to his people. Sometimes they are leading too comfortable a life to accept what is being asked. Amos found this when he was sent, unwillingly, to Judah. All he wanted was an easy life of herding sheep and looking after the trees, but as is often the case God had other plans for him. We are the ones who continue Jesus' message in our own time and because things don't change very much, we need to be prepared to be rejected in one way or another. Not easy for anyone, as Amos found out, but we have no choice since our calling comes from God. If we persevere, the saving grace of God will be brought to those in need. Very little in our life is simply coincidence. God's will is woven into everything that happens to us, even in rejection.

READINGS AT MASS 15TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR, YEAR B, 10TH & 11TH JULY 2021

First Reading Amos 7:12-15

Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, said to Amos, 'Go away, seer;' get back to the land of Judah; earn your bread there, do your prophesying there. We want no more prophesying in Bethel; this is the royal sanctuary, the national temple.' 'I was no prophet, neither did I belong to any of the brotherhoods of prophets,' Amos replied to Amaziah 'I was a shepherd, and looked after sycamores: but it was the Lord who took me from herding the flock, and the Lord who said, "Go, prophesy to my people Israel."'

Second Reading Ephesians 1:3-14
