Living amongst good and evil every day will continue to happen but ultimately God will protect us and win through in the end. By curing the man born blind Jesus fulfils the prophecy of Isaiah in the first reading. We might think it odd in these super hygiene days of putting fingers in ears and touching tongues with spittle but from time to time we will still be involved in the physical. Just putting an arm around someone going through a bad time is often gratefully accepted.
