So, we look forward to welcoming him then.

Developing Parish Life and Diocesan Guidelines on Covid The latest guidelines from the diocese have eased some of the restrictions but wearing facemasks, sanitising hands and maintain social distance is still important. The Parish Council did agree to have one metre social distancing which will enable us to significantly increase capacity of both Churches. In terms of singing, the diocese has advised that we focus on singing Mass parts.

Since the Pandemic we are aware that many sick or elderly have been cautious to attend Mass. We hope that more people will feel confident and safe in attending Mass but I understand if others are still not able to come to Mass. St Cuthbert's Presbytery

At the meeting of the Parish Council on 15th September, it was agreed that the Parish would inform the Diocese that we are willing to lease out the Presbytery to a family as part of the Government Resettlement Programme, with Tyneside Welcomes as the Lead Sponsor, for refugees who have been given leave to remain in the UK. We now wait for the Diocese to formally approve of the proposal.

Volunteers for Nite Bite Wanted

Two of the cooks for Nite Bite, who have done a fantastic job for around 15 years, have decided to take a well-earned rest.

Nite Bite is therefore in need of some new cooks before it can reopen for hot food, which the team hopes it might as the colder months arrive. The kitchen team usually arrives during the early afternoon on a Tuesday, cooking a meal of soup, main course and a pudding for 4pm, for around 30-40 people.

The meals aren't elaborate, just simple and filling, so Michelin stars aren't a prerequisite. Some of team have already offered to do one or two weeks per month, so it would be great to find volunteers who could offer more regularly, but even if someone couldn't commit to weekly, it would be good to hear from them.

Rather, it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, and restore strength to our hands for our common mission (PD, 32). Thus the objective of this Synodal Process is not only a series of exercises that start and stop, but rather a journey of growing authentically towards the communion and mission that God calls the Church to live out in the third millennium"
