SUNDAY REFLECTION

He directed his writing towards the Gentiles, being one himself. His gospel provides the readings for most of the Sundays of the year. As this new year begins, it looks to the end, to the destruction of Jerusalem. This is seen as the foretaste of the final liberation at the second coming of Christ. Jesus gives the last address of his public ministry and he is clearly fretful about the future as he paints a bleak picture of the end of the world. Nations are in agony and bewilderment, people are dying of fear of the power which menaces the world. In short, a nightmare will descend on every living being on the face of the earth. However, nightmares are bad experiences we usually wake up from, not ones we stay awake for. It is a symbol of freedom from the toil of evil in which humanity is embroiled, and the final triumph of Christ. **Deacon Terry**

You are asked to reflect on the questions during Advent and Christmas, and a gathering for reflection for parishioners from across the Partnership will take place at St Cuthbert's, North Shields, on Saturday, 29 January 2022.
