The Cycle of Prayer:

Summer

During Ordinary Time (Summer) we are asked to pray for these intentions: **A Deeper Understanding between Christians and Jews; Those Who Suffer Persecution, Oppression and Denial of Human Rights; Europe; Human Life; Seafarers.**

SUNDAY REFLECTION

The first thing we know about God is that we cannot know about God. Our knowledge of the three persons who are one can never be perfect in this life, but we edge towards the idea that there is diversity within God and this is the beginning of our understanding of the Trinity. Paul has a triple formula when he talks of God. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, we are brought into peace with God, and the love of God is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. All we need take from the Gospel on the Trinity is this sentence; "when the Spirit of truth comes, he will lead you to the complete truth".

PARISH COVID CONTROLS

SUNDAY OBLIGATION

The Bishops of England and Wales have resolved that, from Pentecost Sunday, 5 June 2022, the Sunday Mass obligation is no longer impeded. The Bishops stress that those who still do not feel safe enough to return to Mass should not do so. All other Catholics are subject to the precept to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holydays of Obligation. Live streaming of Masses has been a great benefit to many during the pandemic, and will continue to be for those genuinely unable to attend Mass. The Bishops remind us, however, that watching a live streamed Mass does not fulfil the obligation. The full resolution of the Bishops' Conference can be read on the diocesan website.

First Reading

Proverbs 8:22-31

The Wisdom of God cries aloud: The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries – and the waters will not invade the shore – when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men.

Romans 5:1-5

He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: *All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.*'
