The Cycle of Prayer

Autumn During Ordinary Time from September to Advent, we are asked to pray for these intentions: Students and Teachers; The Spread of the Gospel; Harvest; the Fruits of Human Work, and the Reverent Use of Creation; Justice and Peace in

the World; All Victims of War; Young People; Prisoners and their Families.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

In today's gospel religious attitudes collide. The sinners gather to listen to Jesus and the ones, who believe themselves upright, grumble that he welcomes them just as much as anyone else. They try to keep separate from these people but Jesus believes in associating with them -seeing them as lost sheep. So he tells the story of the Father who has problems with his two Sons but lives in hope that all will be resolved in the fullness of time. One son leaves yearning for a better life, but returns when the going gets tough. The other stays and feels upset when his Father celebrates that his brother has come back after leading the high life. Jesus' attitude of treating everyone in the same way holds a message for us today. It is of forgiveness and tolerance with our fellow people with whom we share this world. **Deacon Terry**

Celebrating the beauty of our Faith — 18th September 2022. Evangelii Gaudium Sunday calls us to be joyous in proclaiming our faith. "Evangelii Gaudium" is Latin for "Joy of the Gospel". READINGS AT MASS 24TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR, YEAR C, 10TH & 11TH SEPTEMBER 2022

First Reading Exodus 32:7-11,13-14

The Lord spoke to Moses, 'Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostatised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. "Here is your God, Israel," they have cried "who brought you up from the land of Egypt!"' the Lord said to Moses, 'I can see how headstrong these people are! Leave me, now, my wrath shall blaze out against them and devour them; of you, however, I will make a great nation.' But Moses pleaded with the Lord his God. 'Lord,' he said 'why should your wrath blaze out against this people of yours whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with arm outstretched and mighty hand? Remember Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, your servants to whom by your own self you swore and made this promise: "I will make your offspring as many as the stars of heaven, and all this land which I promised I will give to your descendants, and it shall be their heritage for ever." Gospel Luke 15:1-10

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. So he spoke this parable to them: 'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance. 'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.' (*The Parable of the Prodigal Son follows*).
