During Ordinary Time from September to Advent, we are asked to pray for these intentions: Students and Teachers; The Spread of the Gospel; Harvest; the Fruits of Human Work, and the Reverent Use of Creation; Justice and Peace in the World; All Victims of War; Young People; Prisoners and their Families.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

Self-satisfaction with one's life compared with those less fortunate is a theme of this week's readings. Amos seems to be condemning enjoyment, however, this is not the case. It is not wealth as such, it is the complacency and disregard for others he dislikes. The rich man ignores Lazarus at his gate and carries on with his extravagant lifestyle. He may even ask his servants to remove him so that he is not reminded of the poor each day. Abraham does not tell the rich man he is being punished for not considering the poor, he simply explains that the positions of the two are reversed. Lazarus is now comforted while the rich man is tormented. There is an unbreachable chasm between the two. Jesus tells this parable to the Pharisees who are to be compared to the rich man. It is not easy for us to reflect on these readings because they remind us that at some point we will all have to face judgement on how we have considered those less fortunate than ourselves. What we can do is to give thanks for what we have and to pray for those in need.

First Reading Amos 6:1,4-7

The almighty Lord says this: Woe to those ensconced so snugly in Zion and to those who feel so safe on the mountain of Samaria, those famous men of this first of nations to whom the House of Israel goes as client. Lying on ivory beds and sprawling on their divans, they dine on lambs from the flock, and stall-fattened veal; they bawl to the sound of the harp, they invent new instruments of music like David, they drink wine by the bowlful, and use the finest oil for anointing themselves, but about the ruin of Joseph they do not care at all.
