I have had a request to outline the various parish groups. Further to the parish council these are the various parish groups. Apart from the Finance and Property group whose members appoint, the other groups are open to anyone who maybe interested in contributing. The framework for the groups is my conviction that as a parish working together we collectively are called to carry out the following ministries:

- Prophetic and Social Outreach

These ministries are not hermetically sealed with one particular group but I hope you will see that the each of the group mentioned falls within at least of one of these ministries

Liturgy and Formation

This group is currently chaired by Linda Shotton. We explore how we develop the main liturgical season of the year and the spiritual formation of people. Proclaimers.

This group covers the ministries of evangelism and witness and prophetic and social outreach. Social Group

This group has been successfully re-established. This group seeks to develop a sense of unity and cohesion in our diverse parish, so the aim of this group is part of our ministry of peace and reconciliation.
