# **HOLY COMMUNION UNDER BOTH SPECIES**

The Bishops of England and Wales have decided that, given where we are with Covid and that most people are protected with vaccinations, permission is given for Holy Communion under both species (Host and Chalice) to be restored from this Maundy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper. As we know, our Catholic faith professes that when we receive Holy Communion in the Sacred Host and/or the Chalice, we receive the totality of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord, and that we always show reverence and adoration towards the Blessed Sacrament. The Bishops have left the decision to reintroduce Holy Communion under both species and its timing with each parish priest. I'm grateful to the Parish Pastoral Council for our recent discussion, in which concern was expressed for our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who would distribute the Chalice, and for parishioners receiving from the Chalice, and the possible risk of infection, including when ministers consume the remains of the Precious Blood after Holy Communion. I have decided that Holy Communion will continue to be distributed under one species only, the Sacred Host. The situation will be reviewed towards the Feast of Corpus Christi in June. # READINGS AT MASS PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD, YEAR A, 1ST & 2ND APRIL, 2023

Opening Gospel Matthew 21:1-11

When they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village facing you, and immediately you will find an ass tied, and a colt with her: untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, "The Lord has need of them," and he will send them immediately.' This took place to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet, saying, 'Tell the daughter of Sion, Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of an ass.' The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the ass and the colt, and put their garments on them, and he sat thereon. Most of the crowd spread their garments on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. And the crowds that went before him and that followed him shouted, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!' And when he entered Jerusalem, all the city was stirred, saying, 'Who is this?' And the crowds said, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth of Galilee.'
