MASS READINGS

EASTER SUNDAY - A FIRST READING

Acts of the Apostles 10:34. 37-43

We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him. Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'.

Responsorial Psalm This day was made by the Lord; we rejoice and are glad.

- 1. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end. Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.'

GOSPEL John 20:1-9

He must rise from the dead.

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.' So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Easter Sunday

It is hard to imagine how those who had witnessed, taken part or contributed in some way to killing of Jesus would have felt the day after his brutal death. For those who had been his companions there must have been sense of disillusion, futility or perhaps despair. There would also be some guilt that under pressure so many of his companions had walked away. It was the women who had been present and now these same woman add another strand to this strange narrative, the tomb is empty, he has risen. This was not a triumphant fanfare but a group of people who were often ignored, with a surprising message that people found to difficult to accept. But starting with this strange and surprising claim, the power of the Risen Christ is unleashed on the Church that has enabled it to continue to the present day. Forces of destruction and injustice can seem so dominant but the Risen Christ proclaims that these forces will not have the final sav.

In the past year we as a community have continued to emerge from the shadows of lockdown. We have said farewell to many much loved and valued members of the community but almost every week has a new face among us. We also enable a family of refuges to make their home at St Cuthbert's. While we were still wrestling with what it means to be synodal Church, there has been the surprise announcement of Bishop Robert and the various investigations taking place. Some may have felt a sense of bewilderment and shock and struggle.

On this Easter Sunday we are reminded that creative life giving forces are not far away and can still radiate among us. Whatever finding the various investigation's come up with, we are called to place our trust in a crucified and risen Christ, that was so powerful that it transformed the motley crew of his failing companions and which can transform our Church at a local, diocesan and international level.

I would like to express my thanks to all who have so generously and powerfully contributed to the Holy Week Liturgies. Watching the Liturgies on online was not thought I would be doing at the start of the week. Thanks to all parishioners who have helped me in getting everything sorted in my absence and a special thanks to Brother John

Cavanagh OFM and Fr Peter Randall SJ who have ensured that all the Holy Week Liturgies can take place

I am also grateful for the support and prayers for my family which has had three deaths in the past two months.

I will be away straight after Easter (covid permitting) and return on April 21st. I am very grateful to Canon Stempczyk and Fr Randall S.J who will preside at the Eucharists next week-end.

Tyne and Wear Citizens

We had a issues workshop on March 29th to hear what issues are coming from the listening. Here is a helpful summary from one our organiser, Claire Rodgerson

The cost-of-living crisis – rising costs of food, energy and more – wages not keeping up with this (even the rLW), barriers to claiming benefits, families and single people all struggling Housing – the private rented market being unaffordable with often low quality housing, including student landlords, housing associations not being responsive to need

Migrant justice – uncertainty caused by EU settled status, cost of transport and situations in countries of origin; housing providers for asylum seekers are not treating their tenants with respect

Working conditions – low wages, different wages for 16, 18, 20, 23+ year olds, lack of and low quality opportunities. Specific issues with a factory in Sunderland and bereavement leave Mental ill-health – lack of accessible, timely support, feeling unsafe in school and on streets, isolation post-pandemic, permacrisis causing stress and anxiety

Climate change- the lack of affordable green sources of energy, cost of energy and suppression of protest

Infrastructure – Metros need improvement, public transport needs improvement, pavements and buildings inaccessible. Racism on the metro

Health – no dentists for NHS patients, access to good quality GP care is limited, increasing dependency on drugs and alcohol

Education – racism, lack of adequate SEND provision Political disenfranchisement- the system is not working for us. Please contact Fr Chris if any of the above is a shared concern or has arisen from your listening. If you have any stories that relates to the above please also share them with me
