Exodus 19:2-6

I will count you a kingdom of priests, a consecrated nation.

SECOND READING Romans 5:6-11

Now that we have been reconciled by the death of his Son, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son.

We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man – though of course for some really worthy, a man might be prepared to die – but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

GOSPEL Matthew 9:36-10:8

He summoned his twelve disciples and sent them out.

When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is rich, but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest."

He summoned his twelve disciples, and gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows:

"Do not turn your steps to pagan territory, and do not enter any Samaritan town; go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge."

Catholic Safeguarding Standard Agency (CSSA)Report

As I would imagine most of you are aware, on Monday, the CSSA published it report on Safeguarding in the Diocese. The report now states that minimum standards are now being kept and progress is being made in addressing concerns but there had been persistent failures in the diocese to maintain proper standards. Particular attention was given to Bishop Robert's appointment of Canon McCoy as Dean at the Cathedral against advice of many in the diocese and that concerns about his behaviour had been raised in 1996, 2007, 2010 and 2019. The other concern was Bishop Robert's association with Fr Tim Gardner OP. Despite guidance that Fr Gardner was not to reside in Diocesan properties since he was on the Sex Offender Register, Bishop Robert ignored this advice.

has had to say has not been easy. I am pleased that this report is being transparent and that the diocese has accepted all 12 recommendations that have been made. In the gospel for this week-end Christ feels for his people and I feel for you.
