DOUAI MARTYRS MASS — 3 NOVEMBER

During the centuries when it was illegal to be Catholic in this country, priests were trained at the college in Douai in France. Many came back to England to serve the Catholic community and were martyred for the Faith. Ushaw is the successor to the college at Douai, and an annual Mass to commemorate the Douai Martyrs is an important event in Ushaw's calendar. The martyrs' feast day is 30 October but this year, Ushaw's Mass to honour them will be celebrated on 3 November at 12.30pm in St Cuthbert's Chapel, Ushaw. Everyone is welcome to attend. Admission is free.

There will be an opportunity to learn the choral parts, or just sing along with the melody. This promises to be a fun and rewarding afternoon. READINGS AT MASS 30TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR, YEAR A, 28TH & 29TH OCTOBER, 2023

First Reading Exodus 22:20-26

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this: '"You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. "If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him. "If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."
