MASS READINGS

THIRTIETH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR - A FIRST READING

Exodus 22:20-26

If you are harsh with the widow, or with the orphan, my anger will flare against you.

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this: "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. "If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him. "If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity.""

SECOND READING Thessalonians 1:5-10

You broke with idolatry and became servants of God; you are now waiting for his Son.

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread – and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.

GOSPEL Matthew 22:34-40

You must love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself.

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the Law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: You must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

Feedback from Parish Council Meeting of 24.10.23

The parish council met last Tuesday. The main focus was the General Meeting.

Young People in the Church

The council discussed how we can encourage more young people into the life of the parish. We decided that we would ask those young members who are part of involved. There will be pizza after Mass on Sunday 3rd December for young parishioners, 12-16.

Mass Times

We did discuss the request expressed by a majority of people at the meeting that the Mass time on a Sunday to be earlier. I acknowledged that the present times for all the parishes in the partnership were agreed, so we could supply for each other when needed. The parish has benefitted from this arrangement in that Canon Martin has said Mass at St Joseph's a number of times while I am away or have teaching commitments. Occasionally, Canon Martin has asked me asked to help when he has other commitments or is away This is likely to increase with fewer priests.

As the current set up of the partnership exists, any change to Sunday Mass at St Cuthbert's, would be to 10.30am at the earliest, so if needed I could say a 9.30 Mass elsewhere, on the understanding that Mass maybe a bit late starting on those occasions. I do not know how long the current situation will last, though with fewer priests, the current arrangement will not last for ever. When there is a restructuring in the partnership, it is very uncertain what Mass provision will be but I advise that we cross that bridge when we collectively face it.

Meeting of Group Representatives

It was agreed that there should be a regular if not frequent meeting of representatives of the various groups. There will be a meeting of parish group reps in the year. It was also agreed that there should be a mailing list of group rep so that other groups know what is happening.
