## 20th SUNDAY OF THE YEAR - B FIRST READING

Proverbs 9:1-6

Eat my bread,, drink the wine I have prepared for you.

Wisdom has built herself a house, she has erected her seven pillars, she has slaughtered her beasts, prepared her wine, she has laid her table. She has despatched her maidservants and proclaimed from the city's heights: "Who is ignorant? Let him step this way." To the fool she says, "Come and eat my bread, drink the wine I have prepared! Leave your folly and you will live, walk in the ways of perception.

Be very careful about the sort of lives you lead, like intelligent and not like senseless people. This may be a wicked age, but your lives should redeem it. And do not be thoughtless but recognise what is the will of the Lord. Do not drug yourselves with wine, this is simply dissipation; be filled with the Spirit. Sing the words and tunes of the psalms and hymns when you are together, and go on singing and chanting to the Lord in your hearts, so that always and everywhere you are giving thanks to God who is our Father in the name of our Lod Jesus Christ.

Alleluia, alleluia! The Word was made flesh and lived among us; to all who Did accept him he gave power to become children of God. Alleluia.

GOSPEL John 6:51-58

My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.

Jesus said to the crowd: "I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world."

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" they said. Jesus replied: "I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. An yone who does eat my flesh and rink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is read food, and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and rinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate; they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever."

#### 20th Sunday of the Year

As we continue to explore Chapter 6 of John's Gospel in this summer interlude from Mark's Gospel, it is in this passage that we have the strongest resonances with the Eucharist- "For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink". John's Gospel does not have any story about the institution of the Eucharist but this passage makes clear that the community that John was writing his Gospel for had the Eucharist as part of their community life. We know from the teaching of the Church that in the Eucharist is Christ truly present but what does the Eucharist tell us about this Christ and ourselves: I would venture some thoughts for your own reflection

- We need physical and spiritual nourishment
- The shape and dynamic of the loving God of the trinity is outward and downwards. An emptying selfgiving love
- Christ is the ultimate sacrament of God and that all of creation is sacramental
- God is giver and gift
- God is humble and vulnerable
- God is attentive and present to us, calling us to reflect this attentive and loving gaze back and onward to others

#### **Pope Francis on Prayer**

Dear Brothers and Sisters, today we conclude our series of catechesis on prayer by turning once again to the prayer of Jesus. In the final hours of his life, Jesus' constant dialogue with the Father becomes all the more intense, as he approaches his saving death and resurrection. In the great "priestly prayer" of the Last Supper, Jesus intercedes for his disciples and for all those who will believe through their word. In the agony in the garden, he offers his anguish to the Father and lovingly embraces his will. At the darkest hour of his suffering on the cross, Jesus continues to pray, using the traditional words of the Psalms, identifying himself with the poor and abandoned of our world. In those moments, the crucified Lord takes upon himself the burden of all the sins of the world. For our sake, he experiences the distance separating sinners from God, and becomes the supreme and eternal intercessor for all mankind. In our own life of prayer,

may we always be mindful that the Lord never ceases to pray for us, uniting us to his own eternal dialogue of love with the Father in the communion of the Holy Spirit.
