Advent & Christmas

During Advent and Christmastide we are asked to pray for these intentions: Migrants and Refugees; Expectant Mothers.

This Advent, we stand close to the Pilgrims of Hope Jubilee Year of 2025 announced by Pope Francis. We hear the Jubilee call to set out on a journey. The journey moves us away from our comfort and our surroundings. Christian hope rings through the Advent scriptures and gives light to our pilgrimage. Hope shows the faces of our pilgrim companions who are confident and joyful. The Holy Spirit brightens the approaching dawn of Jesus' birth. Our heavenly Father tenderly watches over us and opens the way to Jesus, his Son, the pathway to eternal life. This Advent, our pilgrimage is gradual, with moments of reflection and celebration.
