NEW TRANSLATION OF THE LECTIONARY From the First Sunday of Advent, 1 December, the Catholic Church in England and Wales will start using a new translation of the Lectionary based on the Catholic Edition of the English Standard Version (ESV) of the Bible. This will be for all the readings at Mass, the sacraments and funerals. Two sets of the new Lectionary have arrived, one for each church. Each set has four volumes covering the Sunday and weekday readings for Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter, Ordinary Time, Feasts of the Saints, Commons including Our Lady and Ritual Masses and Masses for the Dead. The total cost is £1390, £695.00 for each set. The books are beautifully made, as would be expected for God's Word, and will last for many years. Parishioners are invited to contribute towards the cost of the new Lectionary by making a donation in memory of their deceased loved ones. The names of your loved ones will be inscribed in the front of the new lectionaries as a sign of dedication and prayer. Envelopes are available at the back church on which to write the names of your loved ones, and seal your donation inside. All donations gratefully received. Mgr Andrew

First Reading

Daniel 12:1-3

This is part of a vision of the prophet Daniel about the end of time. It introduces the belief in a resurrection of the dead.

At that time Michael will stand up, the great prince who mounts guard over your people. There is going to be a time of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence. When that time comes, your own people will be spared, all those whose names are found written in the Book. Of those who lie sleeping in the dust of the earth many will awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting disgrace. The learned will shine as brightly as the vault of heaven, and those who have instructed many in virtue, as bright as stars for all eternity.

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 15

Response: **Preserve me, God, I take refuge in you.**

1. O Lord, it is you who are my portion and cup;
it is you yourself who are my prize.
I keep the Lord ever in my sight:
since he is at my right and, I shall stand firm.

Second Reading

Hebrews 10:11-14.18

This reading insists on the superiority of Christ's sacrifice over all the sacrifices of the old law.

All the priests stand at their duties every day, offering over and over again the same sacrifices which are quite incapable of taking sins away. Christ, on the other hand, has offered one single sacrifice for sins, and then taken his place for ever, at the right hand of God, where he is now waiting until his enemies are made into a footstool for him. By virtue of that one single offering, he has achieved the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying. When all sins have been forgiven, there can be no more sin offerings.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia. Stay awake and stand ready, because you do not know the hour when the Son of Man is coming. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading

Mark 13:24-32

This talks about the second coming of Christ, the time of which is known only to God.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven. 'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.'
