OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA — PARISH COUNCIL OPEN MEETING — 14 MAY

The PPC met last Wednesday at Immaculate Heart and items brought before the meeting included the current position regarding Our Lady's & St. Edmund's where the Diocese is entering into discussions with Northumberland Estates about the possible sale to the Estate. It is hoped that some of the pews still in the former church can be put to good use. Bishop Paul Mason, whose family have a long association with the former Our Lady's & St. Edmund's Parish has asked if he could take the baptismal font and this has been agreed. An update was provided on the possible use of contactless payments in the parish and the general view was that their introduction would have positive benefits. There was unanimous approval from the meeting to go ahead with this. A Social Committee report was given indicating the events planned for the remainder of the year and after the recent Irish night, when £381 was raised, the CAFOD Health Clinic Fund now stands at £2675.20. Our Easter services were well supported, and thanks were expressed for the great collaboration between the parishes with regard to the musical preparation. It was a great blessing to see so many new people join the Church at our Easter vigil service.
