Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-12

Brothers and Sisters: Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. For by it the people of old received their commendation.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.

Stay awake and be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect. Alleluia.

Gospel Luke 12:32-48

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, 'Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions, and give to the needy. Provide yourselves with money bags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. 'Stay dressed for action and keep your lamps burning, and be like men who are waiting for their master to come home from the wedding feast, so that they may open the door to him at once when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. Truly, I say to you, he will dress himself for service, and have them recline at table, and he will come and serve them. If he comes in the second watch, or in the third, and finds them awake, blessed are those servants! But know this, that if the master of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have left his house to be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

Peter said, 'Lord, are you telling this parable for us or for all?' And the Lord said, 'Who then is the faithful and wise manager, whom his master will set over his household, to give them their portion of food at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master will find so doing when he comes. Truly, I say to you, he will set him over all his possessions. But if that servant says to himself, "My master is delayed in coming", and begins to beat the male and female servants, and to eat and drink and get drunk, the master of that servant will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour he does not know, and will cut him in pieces and put him with the unfaithful. And that servant who knew his master's will but did not get ready or act according to his will, will receive a severe beating. But the one who did not know, and did what deserved a beating, will receive a light beating. Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required, and from him to whom they entrusted much, they will demand the more.'

19th Sunday of the Year

One of the pastoral questions that the early Church had to face and was addressed by the writers of the New Testament was that the imminent expectation of the return of Jesus was taking longer than they thought. For many following Jesus was supposed to be a quick sprint but it has turned out to be a long race, lasting 2,000 years and counting! For an early Church, the question was how to keep going as they waited. The Gospel is telling the early Christian community St Luke was writing for that they need to persevere. For us 2,000 years later, the question is what keep us persevering. There is the paradox of wanting to keep going, you need to stop. The sabbath rest idea has a lot of wisdom. If we do not stop we will not keep going.

What has helped you in the faith journey. What is it that you need to keep the flame of faith and discipleship renewed. No one knows where the finishing tape is for our journey, all we have is the next mile to go on to. What will enable to run that mile of life and faith with vigour as opposed to limping on. We are not solo runners, with the help of the Spirit and our community, may we have the strength to carry on, able to stop so we can continue with faith, hope and love.
