First reading Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

In those days: The officials said to the king, 'Let this man, Jeremiah, be put to death, for he is weakening the hands of the soldiers who are left in this city, and the hands of all the people, by speaking such words to them. For this man is not seeking the welfare of this people, but their harm.' King Zedekiah said, 'Behold, he is in your hands, for the king can do nothing against you.' So they took Jeremiah and cast him into the cistern of Malchiah, the king's son, which was in the court of the guard, letting Jeremiah down by ropes. And there was no water in the cistern, but only mud, and Jeremiah sank in the mud.

Ebed-melech went from the king's house and said to the king, 'My lord the king, these men have done evil in all that they did to Jeremiah the prophet by casting him into the cistern, and he will die there of hunger, for there is no bread left in the city.' Then the king commanded Ebed-melech the Ethiopian, 'Take thirty men with you from here, and lift Jeremiah the prophet out of the cistern before he dies.'

20th Sunday of the Year

The Gospel reminds me of the saying of one my spiritual heroines, Flannery O'Connor. She said you cannot reduce faith to an electric blanket; it is the cross that we are asked to take up. The protestant theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer said that there is no such thing as 'cheap' grace. The Gospel is always a challenge to the given status quo for any culture. It will upset people! To follow Jesus is a challenge, but it is way of transformation and growth for society and souls!

To follow Christ is to engage with reality, and reality can be tough. The readings call us to face our challenges. The first reading has the image of Jeremiah being lowed into a well and sinking in the mud! Perhaps it is an image you can relate to! But in the story, an Ethiopian outsider pleads to the King on Jeremiah's behalf and 30 men are dispatched to rescue him. Jeremiah was sinking in the mud since he sought God's will and challenged the status quo, but consolation came. His cry was heard and through others he was rescued

The Gospel is a challenge but we are given grace and we are part of a community supporting each other, so that the sufferings of the now are gateways to God's consolation and his risen life.
