Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

Brothers and Sisters: Have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons? 'My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives.' It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed.

21st Sunday of the Year

The Gospel for this weekend is something of a paradox for me. The demand of the gospel is made clear, 'strive to get through the narrow door for many I tell you will seek to enter and will not be able'. And vet there is a sense of universalism to the passage, 'and people will come from east and west, from north and south'. What are we to make of this? St Luke is the only one of the 4 evangelists who was born a gentile. He knows that the Gospel is for all, the invite to share in God's offer. Grace is gift offered to all, but it is an invite that needs a response. Responding to the invitation for is the 'narrow door'. We have no rights if we make no response. Distinctions between people are dissolved in Christ, but this grace is gift from God. Like all gifts, this brings a sense of responsibility to use that gift the way God intended. We have rights as citizens but not as members of the Kingdom. As members of the Kingdom, we are joyful partaker of God's offer of new life, but this invitation calls for a faithful response.
