First reading Numbers 21:4b-9

'If anyone were bitten by a serpent, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.'

In those days: The people became impatient on the way. And the people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food.' Then the Lord sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. And the people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned, for we have spoken against the Lord and against you. Pray to the Lord, that he take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live.' So Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on a pole. And if a serpent bit anyone, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.

Response: Never forget the deeds of the LORD!

- 1. Give ear, my people, to my teaching; incline your ear to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth in a parable and utter hidden lessons of the past.
- 3. Yet they deceived him with their mouths: they lied to him with their tongues. For their hearts were not steadfast towards him; they were not faithful to his covenant.
- 2. When he slew them, then they sought him, repented and earnestly sought God. They would remember that God was their rock, God the Most High their redeemer.

Second reading

Philippians 2:6-11 'He humbled himself, therefore God has highly exalted him.' Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled

himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

'The Son of Man must be lifted up.'

Exaltation of the Holy Cross

We take a break from the Ordinary Sundays of the Year since the Feast of Exaltation (or Triumph) of the Holy Cross.

Although the focus of the feast for today is an object, the Cross, what lies behind today feast and what is central to it is an action. It is the action of self-giving of God to us in Christ. This is what grace is. As the second reading informs that although 'Jesus was in the form of God he did not count equality of God a thing to be grasped but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of God. He humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death-death on a cross'. So the Cross is a code word for sacrificial, self-giving love. A God is revealed, that gives, that pours out himself, that gives himself to humanity for our liberation and transformation. We are all called to know this self-giving, so that this divine reality can flow within us and radiate through us.

It is this self-giving love that seeks us to unite in solidarity and compassion with humanity and creation. We celebrate this solidarity and compassion in our Mission this week. Parishioners will be sharing their experiences and their dreams as seek a fairer and more just and peaceful world. Please come if you can to at least one of our events to celebrate the rich gifts of the People of our parish.
