**First reading** **Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13**  
Seek the Lord, all you humble of the land, who do his just commands; seek righteousness; seek humility; perhaps you may be hidden on the day of the anger of the Lord.  
I will leave in your midst a people humble and lowly. They shall seek refuge in the name of the Lord, those who are left in Israel; they shall do no injustice and speak no lies, nor shall there be found in their mouth a deceitful tongue. For they shall graze and lie down, and none shall make them afraid.

And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness, and sanctification, and redemption; so that, as it is written, ‘Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.’

### Fourth Sunday of the Year

For the next three Sundays before we start Lent on February 18, we have the first part of the Sermon on the Mount. Having this teaching on a mountain St Matthew is making strong connections with the teaching of Moses and the giving of the commandments on Mount Sinai. For Matthew, Jesus is Moses 2.0. As the sermon progresses, we see Matthew's perception of Jesus' teaching as being found on the Jewish law but he is developing it within the context of Jesus' vision of the Kingdom of God. The sermon starts with the beatitudes. These 9 beatitudes can be seen as the qualities needed to be children of the Kingdom of God developing St Luke's beatitudes and woes that say something of God who is committed to the poor, hungry, sad and persecuted. We are to imitate this God, we need the mindset of these 9 beatitudes. Which of these beatitudes you have already? Which you need to pray for the grace for? This passage is worth reflecting on discerning which of these are relevant to us at this time.
