OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA — OFFERTORY PAYMENTS USING GIFT AID ENVELOPES

Within our Parish, the number of parishioners submitting offertories using Gift Aid Envelopes has now decreased to a total of five across both churches. The minimum number of envelopes we can order is twenty, at a cost of over £100, which we feel is not economical to continue using. Many offertories are also received via bank transfers into the parish bank account, quoting envelope numbers, which is unnecessary, as long as your identity is contained in the reference box. We are contacting the existing users of Gift Aid Envelopes to explore alternative offertory arrangements, including Bank Transfers, Contactless Payments via the card reader machines in the churches, the Collection Plate at Mass or donating at the Parish Office. We are very grateful for the generosity that is shown by everyone in the Parish.
